Name and Description

The academic *Journal of Romanian Studies* (JRS) is a bi-annual periodical that publishes scholarly articles on various theoretical and empirical aspects of the history and current affairs of Romania, Moldova, their diverse citizen groups, and the Romanian diaspora. The Journal's editors, its advisory board, and ibidem Press expect all authors to abide by the standards of academic ethics.

Publishing Schedule

The JRS publishes two issues per year.

Ownership and Management

The JRS is published by the Society for the Romanian Studies in collaboration with ibidem Press.

Advisory Board

The advisory board assists the journal editors in fulfilling their responsibilities. It consists of twelve senior scholars from a variety of disciplines, all of whom are specialists in Romanian Studies, broadly conceived. Their names and contact details are listed on the JRS website.

Responsibilities of the journal editors

The journal's editors are responsible for deciding which articles submitted to the journal will be accepted for publication. They coordinate the peer-review process. Articles submitted to the JRS will be evaluated without regard to the authors' race, gender, sexual orientation,

religious belief, ethnic origin, citizenship, or political orientation. The decision by JRS to publish an article is based on its scholarly merits (originality, methodological soundness and its application, clarity of analysis and presentation), as well as its relevance to the field of Romanian studies.

The review process is conducted with the utmost confidentiality. Any information about a submitted article will not be disclosed to anyone other than the corresponding author, reviewers, potential reviewers, other editorial advisers, and the publisher, if and when appropriate. Unpublished materials disclosed in a submitted article will not be used in the editors' or reviewers' research without the express written consent of the author(s).

Publication Ethics

JRS editors will strive to prevent any potential conflict of interest between the authors of a submitted article and the editorial and review personnel. If an ethical complaint is made concerning a submitted or published article, the journal's editors, in cooperation with the publisher, will thoroughly investigate the claim following the procedures outlined in COPE flowcharts and guidance documents (<https://publicationethics.org/resources/flowcharts/general-approach-publication-ethics-editorial-office>). Both co-editors will take part in the investigation and information relating to the complaint shall be available to both co-editors. If research misconduct is shown to have occurred the journal will retract the article. JRS editors will also publish a formal apology to the relevant stakeholders. Complaints about JRS editors can be made to any member of the JRS Advisory Board and the Board as a whole will be involved in the investigation.

Responsibilities of authors

It is the author's responsibility to ensure that the work submitted is original and has not been published elsewhere or in another language, is not under consideration, accepted for publication or in press with another journal, book, etc. The work or words of other authors, contributors, or sources have to be credited and referenced appropriately.

Authors must present an accurate account of their research, as well as an objective discussion of its significance. Underlying data must be represented accurately. Furthermore, the research should be presented in such a way that others are permitted to replicate the work.

Research with humans or animals should conform to international ethical and legal standards. The human participants' right to privacy should be respected; the consent to publish any interview, oral or written expression of thoughts should be obtained from subjects prior to submitting the publication.

Authorship should be limited to those who have made a significant contribution to the conception, design, execution, and interpretation of data in a study that is the subject of an article. All those who have made such contributions should be listed as co-authors. It is the responsibility of the corresponding author to ensure that all co-authors are listed and have approved the final version of the article and its submission. The order in which the authors appear lies with the authors themselves. All authors should include their full name and affiliation on the cover page of the manuscript. One author will be identified as the corresponding author, with his/her email address normally displayed in the article.

All authors should include a statement disclosing any financial or other substantive conflict of interest that might influence the results or interpretation of their article. All sources of financial support for the project should be disclosed.

When an author discovers a significant error or inaccuracy in his/her own published work, it is the author's obligation to promptly notify the journal's editors or the publisher and to cooperate to eliminate or correct the error.

Plagiarism is unacceptable, including all types of written, oral or visual content. The author(s) should obtain the necessary permission to reuse third-party material. Written permission from the copyright owner of third-party material should be obtained prior to submission of the article in accordance with the copyright law of the United States (Title 17).

Self-plagiarism, in whatever language the author published, is to be avoided. The editors and reviewers are expected to raise and clarify any suspected self-plagiarism with the author(s) of the submitted article. Readers are invited to raise the issue of plagiarism and self-plagiarism post-publication by contacting the journal editors.

By submitting an article for publication, authors confirm that their work is meeting the above-stated standards.

Responsibilities of reviewers

The Journal of Romanian Studies is a double-blind peer review academic journal. Reviewers are responsible for assisting in making editorial decisions and, via the journal's editors, may also assist the authors in improving their work.

Articles submitted to JRS will be confidentially, rigorously and objectively be evaluated by two reviewers, experts in the specific discipline applicable to the theme/topic of the submitted article. Critiques should be stated clearly, together with supporting arguments. Personal criticism of the author is inappropriate. Reviewers have to report to the JRS editors or the publisher if they are aware of copyright infringement and plagiarism on the author's side. A reviewer who feels unqualified to review the article, knows that its prompt review will be impossible, or discovers a conflict of interest has to notify the journal editors or the

publisher and excuse herself/himself from the review process.

Publication Charges

There are no submission fees, publication fees or page charges for this journal.

Access

Individual members of the Society for Romanian Studies receive electronic access to two issues of the journal as part of their membership. Individuals and institutions can also buy individual issues. The journal is available to readers in both electronic and printed form.
